Introduction of the College:

The history of Govt. Degree College Sugh Bhatoli goes back to July 1992 when the Saint- Faqir Chand - a man of foresightedness and immense wisdom reflecting his true service to humanity, established the same as Deen Dyal Mahesh Public College. A real applause goes to the sacred soul, public representatives, local and then staff whose abundant efforts proved when the college was taken over by the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh as Government Degree College Sugh Bhatoli, vide Order No EDN-A-Ka(1)-6/2015 of Pr. Secretary (Higher Education) to the Govt. of Himachal Pradesh dated 6th August 2016 . Since its inception, the College has been imparting education in different streams namely BA, B.Com and B.Sc (Non- Medical). The institution is fulfilling the aspirations of the youth in getting their higher education dreams. It is also fulfilling the universalization of higher education needs, one of the prominent goals of the state govt. particularly in the rural areas of the state.

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Activities of Various Cells and Clubs in 2024-25:

1. Red Ribbon Club:

Red Ribbon Club of Govt. Degree College, Sugh Bhatoli was constituted on 20/02/2020 after the sanction received from Chief Medical Officer, Kangra vide letter No. NACP-KGR/IEC- RRC/2019-20/844-858 dated 27January, 2020 regarding the establishment of RRC. The main purpose of this club is to make active involvement of students in social activities related to HIV awareness and TB Mukh Bharat.

- **Flash Mob Activities:** As per the letter No. EDN- HE(21)F(9)07/2020-AIDS on dated 22-08-2024; Red Ribbon Club, GDC, Sugh Bhatoli organised two Flash Mobs.
- **Flash Mob Activity 1:** This activity was organised in the college campus on dated 23/08/2024. The objective of this activity was to raise awareness and challenge the stigma surrounding AIDS. 45 college students participated in this activity.
- **Flash Mob Activity 2:** On dated 28/08/2024, Flash Mob Activity 2 was a rally in the nearby village. The students of the college along with college staff visited the village with a purpose to educate people about stigma and discrimination surrounding AIDS/HIV Positive by distributing pamphlets providing information about AIDS, myths related to AIDS and to avoid discrimination of AIDS patients. 55 college students and college staff enthusiastically visited the village and had conversations with village folk.
- **Rangoli Making Competition:** Before Diwali break on dated 28/10/2024, to spread awareness about tuberculosis, students participated in colorful Rangoli

Making Competition and made everyone aware about the prevention of TB through this creative art of Rangoli Making. Each Rangoli was full of a message how to combat with tuberculosis.

- On dated 18/11/2024, in compliance to the letter received from the Chief Medical Officer, Kangra at Dharamshala, Mrs, Bhavna Kumari, Assistant Professor (Nodal Officer, RRC, GDC, Sugh Bhatoli) and One Peer Educator, Saloni Sharma, student of B.Sc. 3rd Year attended meeting of Red Ribbon Clubs at Meeting Hall of HP Board of School Education, Dharamshala.
- As per the guidelines of Coordinator, Red Ribbon Club Activities, Kangra at Dharamshala RRC of GDC, Sugh Bhatoli organised different events like Declamation Contest, in which total twelve students delivered 3-5 minutes speech on the theme "Take the Right Path, My Health, My Right". Three best students are declared First, Second and Third. Next event was Slogan writing competition. This event aimed to educate and promote awareness AIDS and to encourage collective efforts to prevent the spread of HIV. Students also highlighted the importance of 1st December as World AIDS Day by placing candles around the Red Ribbon. This brightness is to support a positive life even though if somebody is suffering from AIDS. As a part of our efforts to raise awareness about TB and promote global efforts to fight with this disease, GDC, Sugh Bhatoli has planned and organised a comprehensive TB awareness program to coincide with the upcoming World TB Day on 24th March, 2025.
- On dated 18/03/2025, Hand Painting Competition has been organised in the college campus; a creative way to spread awareness about tuberculosis in which 20 college students participated and made beautiful hand paintings.
- On dated 21/03/2025, Red Ribbon Club in collaboration with Anti- Drug Club of GDC, Sugh Bhatoli has organised an Expert Talk on **"Consequences of Drug Addiction in Youth: Social Isolation, Depression and Academic Difficulties"**. Prof. (Dr.) Sushma Rani, an Educational Professional, Head of the Department of Ch. Devi Lal College of Education, Jagadari, Yamunanagar, Haryana was the Resource Person. Prof. Rani motivated the students to live a healthy and balanced life.

- Poster Making Competition: On dated 21/03/2025, Red Ribbon Club, Sugh Bhatoli organised Poster Making Competition to educate the students about TB, its symptoms, diagnosis, treatment and prevention. 40 students made posters on the theme; Yes We can End TB, Commit, Invest and Deliver!

2. Road Safety Club:

In compliance to the orders of the Director of higher Education, Government of Himachal Pradesh, a Road Safety Club was constituted in the Government Degree College, Sugh-Bhatoli, District-Kangra, H.P. on dated 06/01/2022. The main aim of the Club is to enhance the awareness about various issues of road safety among students and society so as to minimize accidents and loss of lives on account of road accidents. Also, the students who learn about various aspects of road safety are expected to make others aware about the importance of road safety so that the message can be spread in all walks of life. In this way everybody will make road safety and its various rule a way of life.

- A Rangoli competition was organized in the College Campus on dated 28-10-2024 under the theme "Be A Road Safety Hero". The event saw enthusiastic participation from students who, with great zeal, showcased their creativity and artistic skills aligning the importance of road safety. This competition not only highlighted the student's talents but also demonstrated the College's commitment to promote social responsibility and awareness through creative avenues.
- On dated 10th February, 2025 a Social Awareness Campaign was organized in village Changrara, tehsil-Indora H.P. by Road safety Club GDC Sugh-Bhatoli. In this campaign, members of Road safety club under the guidance of Nodal officer Dr. Pankaj Kaushal, explained to the people about road safety rules and also asked to follow road safety rules. People were also motivated to wear helmet and seat belts while driving the bike or car. All the staff members were also present during this awareness campaign.
- During the Social awareness program on 10-02-2025, students were distributed Printed T-Shirts. Students participated in the awareness Rally or campaign wearing these T-Shirts.

3. Ranger and Rover:

- In the session 2023-24, first time Ranger and Rover unit of the College has been registered with 'The Bharat Scout and Guide, Himachal Pradesh'. Total 10 Rangers and 6 Rovers were registered for the session 2023-2024.

- This unit is working under the guidance of Rover-leader - Mr. Shivendra Srivastava (Asstt. Prof. History) and Ranger Leader - Dr. Shikha Rana (Asstt. Prof. Physics).
- Rover and Ranger is the senior wing of Scouting and Guiding. The aim of the Unit is to create a better world. The purpose of the movement is to contribute towards the development of young people in achieving their full Physical, Intellectual Social and Spiritual potential as an individual as well as responsible citizens and members of Local, National and International community, through several outdoor activities, social and community service campaigns.
- World Scout Day was celebrated on 22 February 2024 to commemorate the birth anniversary of Lord Robert Baden-Powell, the founder of Boys Scouts movement in 1857. The volunteers of the Rovers and Rangers unit did social service at the local ashram.
- 4. **Electoral Literacy Club:** As per the letter no. EDN-H (8) A (1) Misc. dated 06-07-2022 of the Directorate of Higher Education, H.P. and further the directions issued by CEO, H.P., Electoral Literacy Club was set up in the GDC Sugh-Bhatoli on 7 July 2022. This club intends to promote electoral awareness among students so that they could become informed and responsible citizens of the world's largest democracy.
- In compliance with the directions given by the Secretary, UGC, Constitution Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm at Government Degree College Sugh Bhatoli on 26th November 2024. Dr. Namesh Kumar, the Principal of the college, congratulated the students on this significant occasion and elaborated on the history of the Indian Constitution's formation and its importance in shaping the nation. He also read the Preamble of the Constitution to instill constitutional values among the students. The celebration included a quiz competition which was the highlight of the event. Four teams participated in the quiz, showcasing their knowledge about the Indian Constitution and its principles. Team C, led by Smriti Devi, a BA final-year student, emerged as the winner of the competition. The participating teams were mentored under the able guidance of Associate Professor Shashi Bhushan. The quiz competition was conducted by Shivendra Srivastava, Assistant Professor of History. Approximately 70 students attended the event, which witnessed active participation and enthusiasm from the students.
- On 13th & 26th November 2024, a team of BLOs of election department visited GDC Sugh-Bhatoli under the banner 'BLO Help Desk' to register new voters. All eligible

students have been registered and team appreciated the efforts of Electoral Literacy Club, staff and administration to successfully accomplishing the task.

5. **Eco Club:** International day for the preservation of the Ozone layer was celebrated on 16 September by the Eco club of the college to spread awareness about the deteriorating condition of the layer by the CFCs.
6. **Energy Club:** On the 23rd, August, 2024, the Department of Physics, GDC, Sughbhatoli has organised a declamation competition to celebrate first National Space Day, commemorating the successful landing of the Chandrayaan-3 Vikram lander on the lunar south polar region. National Space Day celebrates the spirit of science, technology, and innovation, inspiring future generations to contribute to India's space program. Saloni Sharma , B.Sc III year stood first, Pallavi, B.A I year stood second and Pallavi, B.A. III year stood third in the declamation competition.
- GDC Sughbhatoli Celebrates Akshay Urja Diwas with Enthusiasm, Pledges to Go Green on August 20, 2024. The GDC Sughbhatoli community came together to observe Akshay Urja Diwas, a day dedicated to promoting renewable energy and sustainable living. The celebration, organized by the college's energy Club and Department of Physics, aimed to raise awareness about the importance of energy conservation and the adoption of green technologies.
7. **Career Counseling and Placement Cell:** In compliance to the directions given by Director of Higher Education & SPD RUSA (Order No EDN-HE(28)G(3)-37/2020-RUSA),dated August 1, 2023, CC&PC of the college was reconstituted. The main activities of the Cell for the session 2024-25 are as following:
 - Coaching classes were conducted by Dept. of Economics for various competitive examinations. Seven students took advantage of the opportunity for more than two months.
 - Alumni were registered for HIMPUN3.0 Mega Job Fair-2024 on 30th August 2024.
 - A movie named "12th Fail" was screened by the cell on 9th September 2024.
 - CC&PC in collaboration with IQAC organized an expert talk on "**Career Opportunities and Imperative Skills: Pathways to Professional Progression**" on 23 rd October 2024. Ms Amandeep Kaur, Director, Institute of Professional Banking& Mankarn Educational Trust Pathankot was the resource person.

- Two days' workshop on "**Basic Computer skills and Personality Development**" was organized for the students in collaboration with CT University Ludhiana. 50 students participated in it.

8. NSS Activities:

- **College Community Embraces Green Initiative:** On Tuesday, July 30, 2024, the NSS Unit and Eco Club of Government Degree College Sugh-Bhatoli actively participated in the Government of India's "Ek Ped Maa ke Naam" campaign by planting 25 diverse saplings within the college's newly established 'vatika'. The vatika, meticulously prepared by volunteers and with the assistance of a JCB machine, now serves as a nurturing ground for the young trees.
- **Swachhta hi Sewa Abhiyan at GDC Sugh-Bhatoli:** On 30th September 2024, the NSS Volunteers along with Rovers and rangers participated in Swachhta hi Sewa campaign. In this they cleaned and weeded out college campus. As this is crucial to remove the hiding place of reptiles like snakes and the breeding areas of mosquitoes.
- **One-day NSS Camp on November 7, 2024:** In one day NSS camp, volunteers pruned trees and bushes to clean the College campus on November 7, 2024. As after the rain flora around the campus could become the potential hideouts for insects and reptiles. Therefore, our volunteers trimmed them to clear the pathway and surroundings of the institution.
- **Cleaning and Maintaining of College Vatika:** On November 11, 2024, our NSS volunteers gathered to rejuvenate the newly developed College Vatika, transforming it into a cleaner, greener space. With great enthusiasm, they weeded out unwanted grass and scrubs, and watered the plants, showcasing their dedication to preserving the environment. This initiative highlights the spirit of teamwork and responsibility towards nature that our students embody.
- **Two-day Training on Disaster Management:** A two days basic course for a task force of youth volunteers on "Disaster Preparedness and Response" was organised by the District Disaster Management Authority, Kangra (HP) in our college. The first day (27 November 2024) of the course aimed to equip youth volunteers with essential skills to effectively respond to disaster situations. On the inaugural day, participants underwent rigorous training in crucial search and rescue techniques. The training module included:
- **Casualty Search Methods:** Volunteers learned systematic approaches to locate individual strapped or injured in disaster-stricken areas.

- **Stretcher Making:** Practical demonstrations and hands-on training were provided to construct improvised stretchers using readily available materials.
- **Victim Rescue Techniques:** Participants were instructed on safe and efficient methods to evacuate victims from hazardous environments.
- **Fire Fighting Demonstration:** Experts showcased fire fighting equipment and techniques, highlighting the importance of early intervention in controlling fires
- **Seven Days Special Annual Camp (24, 25, 26, 29, 30, 31 of December 2024 and 1 January 2025):** The NSS Special Camp, a week-long initiative aimed at fostering community service and cultural exchange was organised in the college campus during 24, 25, 26, 29, 30, 31 of December 2024 and 1 January 2025. The days began with the yoga and physical exercises. In the first half of the day students performed constructive works like shramdan, safai abhiyan, maintaining and repairing the college vatika and local roads. In the second half of the day they performed cultural programmes and guest lectures were also organised to enrich their understanding on international relations, disaster management, cyber security, nationalism, personal hygiene and job opportunities in armed forces. The NSS Special Camp was a resounding success, leaving a lasting impact on the participants and the community. It served as a platform for fostering a sense of social responsibility, cultural appreciation, and camaraderie among the youth.
- **Participation and Contribution of NSS Volunteers in the Organisation of the National Seminar (22 February 2025):** On February 22nd, 2025, the college successfully hosted a National Seminar titled “Synergizing Sustainability: Integrating Environmental, Economic, and Social Development for a Resilient Future”. The National Service Scheme (NSS) volunteers played a crucial role in ensuring the smooth and efficient execution of the event, contributing significantly to its overall success. On the day of Seminar, volunteers assisted guests with registration; they provided support during food service, ensuring smooth distribution and catering to the needs of the attendees. Also, they assisted in guiding the guests to their seats. In the post-seminar support, volunteers assisted the faculty with post-seminar-related tasks, including organizing materials, tidying up the venue, and other logistical support.

9. Women Cell:

- World' Mental Health Day was celebrated by Women Cell in the College on 10th October 2024. WHO's theme for the day is 'Mental Health at Work ' highlighting that safe, healthy working environment act as a protective factor for mental health.

- On 8th March 2025, Government Degree College Sugh-Bhatoli celebrated World Women's Day with great enthusiasm. The session was presided over by the Principal, Dr. Namesh Kumar, and was attended by the entire teaching faculty and students. The event highlighted various aspects of women's rights, empowerment, and gender equality. The celebration began with a lecture by Associate Professor Shashi Bhushan, who provided valuable insights into the historical background of Women's Day, its significance, and discussed the global theme for the year. He also highlighted the importance of gender balance, focusing on the issue of sex ratio and its implications. Assistant Professor Dr. Pankaj Kaushal spoke about the empowerment of women and the need for societal changes to ensure equal opportunities and rights for women in all sectors. Assistant Professor Bhavna Kumari focused on renowned economist Amartya Kumar Sen's views on "Missing Women" and the role of women in economic development and empowerment. Assistant Professor Jagan Singh elaborated on the social evil of Sati Pratha and its consequences, explaining the historical and cultural implications on women's rights. Assistant Professor Shivendra Srivastva provided a detailed account of the historical background of World Women's Day, linking its origins to the struggles for women's rights globally. Assistant Professor Saroti emphasized the significance of respecting women and promoting gender equality in everyday life. The session was moderated by Assistant Professor Bhavna Kumari. The Principal, Dr. Namesh Kumar, concluded the event by emphasizing the critical need for women's empowerment through education, political rights, entrepreneurship and decision-making. This day of celebration highlighted the collective responsibility to uplift and empower women.

10. Tourism Youth Club:

- On the occasion of International Tourism Day, the Tourism Youth Club of the college, in association with the Department of Mathematics & Economics, organized a thought-provoking and informative event, on 27th September 2024. The theme for this year, "Tourism and Peace" aimed at exploring how tourism can act as a catalyst for unity and global peace. The event witnessed active participation from both students and faculty members, making it a vibrant celebration of the spirit of tourism. The event commenced with a welcome address by Dr. Pankaj, Assistant Professor of Mathematics. He set the tone by highlighting the significance of International

Tourism Day and its relevance in today's interconnected world. He discussed the role of tourism in fostering cultural understanding and economic growth.

- Sarvjeet Kaur (B.Com III) presented her paper on "Tourism Circuits of Himachal Pradesh." She delved into the well-established and lesser-known tourist circuits of the state, emphasizing the need for infrastructural development and better connectivity to enhance the tourist experience. Sarvjeet advocated for the promotion of holistic tourism circuits that include not just popular destinations but also off-beat locations rich in natural beauty and cultural heritage.
- Samriti (BA III) shared her views on "Tourism Attractions of Himachal Pradesh." Her presentation highlighted the diverse attractions of the state, from serene hill stations and majestic mountains to vibrant cultural festivals and historic temples. She pointed out that Himachal Pradesh, with its rich tapestry of natural and cultural assets, has immense potential to attract both domestic and international tourists.
- Ritika (BA I) discussed the "Importance of Tourism in the Economy of Himachal Pradesh." She presented statistical data showcasing how tourism significantly contributes to the state's GDP, generating employment and fostering economic growth. Ritika argued that despite its current contribution, there is a need for strategic planning and investment to harness the full potential of the tourism sector.
- Ashneet (BA I) spoke about the "Challenges in the Way of Tourism in Himachal Pradesh." She highlighted various issues such as inadequate infrastructure, environmental degradation, and the impact of over tourism on local communities. Ashneet suggested adopting sustainable tourism practices and enhancing the regulatory framework to address these challenges.

The session concluded with a comprehensive summary by Associate Professor Shashi Bhushan. He emphasized the theme of the day, "Tourism and Peace," and articulated how tourism can serve as a bridge between diverse cultures, fostering mutual understanding and harmony. He cited examples from Georgia, the host country for this year's celebrations, showcasing how tourism can bring people together across geographical and cultural boundaries. Prof. Bhushan also highlighted that the tourism sector contributes approximately 7% to Himachal Pradesh's GDP and 9% to India's GDP, underscoring the need for further growth and development in this sector.

Digilocker Accounts and Academic Bank of Credit IDs:

As per the requirement of NEP 2020, students of the college have been delivered lecture on the importance of the Digilocker Accounts and ABC IDs. All active students have made their accounts on Digilocker and consequently ABC IDs or APAAR IDs.

Students' Grievances and Internal Complaints Cell Mechanism:

The Cell functions to look into the grievances or problems or issues related to academic matters, examination, health services, library, scholarship, matters related to discipline etc. are brought in the ambit of the cell through Principal. Then proper mechanism is followed to resolve the issues. In the session 2023-24, a total of 14 major problems related to academics, examination, and infrastructure have been resolved within stipulated time period. IQAC monitors all such matters to enhance the teaching-learning quality in the institution.

Google forms for Enrollment Registration and Feedback:

- In the session 2024-25, to enhance students' strength in the college a Google Form was circulated among school students for admission registration in the session 2024-25.
- Students' feedback, parents' feedback and teachers' feedback forms have also been circulated to strengthen feedback of teaching-learning quality in the college.

ICT Lab:

In this session AG department through DHE, HP has donated 5 computers to GDC Sugh- Bhatoli. Consequently, ICT Lab has been established with the cooperation of PTA to arrange supplementary infrastructure like furniture, software updating, electricity fittings etc. Students of the college now can take advantage of ICT lab with internet facility.

College Library:

Efforts have been taken to strengthen College library resources. Number of books have been increased; computer with internet facility has also been introduced in the library. Assistant Librarian and library attendant have attended one day workshop at GDC Dehri to enhance their knowledge about the need of library resources as per NEP 2020. Recognizing the central role that libraries play in the academic environment, the Department of Higher Education, Government of Himachal Pradesh, has launched an initiative to rank the libraries of government colleges across the state. As part of this initiative, an inspection team

comprising Dr. Pradeep Kumar Principal GDC Baijnath and Dr. Mohinder Pal Principal SVBGDC Palampur visited Government College Sugh-Bhatoli to assess the library's resources and infrastructure. The team commended the institution's efforts to equip its library with adequate resources, reflecting a commitment to foster a robust academic atmosphere.

Sports Activities:

- Players of the college have been participating in various intercollege competitions. This year players participated in sports like Wrestling, Volleyball, Kabbadi etc.
- Annual sports meet was organised at the college ground on 27 February 2024. Students gave the performance of their strength, stamina and endurance through events like 100m race, 200m race, relay 4*100 meters, shot-put, long jump and tug of war etc.

Summary of the New Initiatives taken by IQAC:

The following new initiatives have been taken to enhance the quality of teaching and learning in the institution:

- To improve the quality of teaching –learning in the college teachers have been persuaded to follow blended mode of teaching.
