- a) **Cultural Activities:** Students prepared cultural items which become the part of NSS Annual Function and Annual Day of the College at the end of the session.

b) **Rovers Rangers/NSS/NCC/Adventure Sports:**

1. The Red Ribbon Club (RRC): RRC of Govt. Degree College, Sugh Bhatoli, was constituted on 20th February 2020, following sanction from the Chief Medical Officer, Kangra. The primary objective of the club is to involve students in raising awareness about HIV/AIDS and contributing to the "TB Mukht Bharat" campaign through active participation in social and health-related activities. In alignment with guidelines from health authorities, the club organized two impactful **Flash Mob Activities** in August 2024. The first was conducted on 23rd August within the college campus, where 45 students performed to challenge the stigma associated with AIDS. The second, on 28th August, was a rally in a nearby village involving 55 students and staff. Pamphlets were distributed, and villagers were engaged in meaningful conversations to educate them about HIV/AIDS, its myths, and the importance of eliminating discrimination. To creatively spread awareness about tuberculosis, a **Rangoli Making Competition** was held on 28th October 2024, before Diwali break. Students used Rangoli art to convey messages on TB prevention and control. On 18th November 2024, RRC Nodal Officer Mrs. Bhavna Kumari and Peer Educator Saloni

Sharma represented the college at a district-level RRC meeting held at the HP Board of School Education, Dharamshala. To observe **World AIDS Day** (1st December), RRC conducted a series of events. A **Declamation Contest** with the theme “Take the Right Path, My Health, My Right” saw 12 participants deliver powerful speeches, with three winners selected. A **Slogan Writing Competition** followed, aimed at spreading HIV/AIDS awareness and promoting collective action against the disease. Students also lit candles around the symbolic red ribbon, expressing solidarity and support for those living with HIV/AIDS. In continuation of TB awareness efforts, RRC planned various activities around **World TB Day (24th March 2025)**. On 18th March, a **Hand Painting Competition** was held, where 20 students creatively showcased TB awareness themes. On 21st March, the RRC collaborated with the **Anti-Drug Club** to organize an **Expert Talk** on “Consequences of Drug Addiction in Youth,” delivered by Prof. (Dr.) Sushma Rani, Head of Department at Ch. Devi Lal College of Education, Haryana. The session emphasized the negative impact of substance abuse on youth, such as social isolation, depression, and academic decline. On the same day, a **Poster Making Competition** was organized under the theme “Yes We Can End TB: Commit, Invest and Deliver!” Around 40 students participated, making informative posters about TB symptoms, prevention, diagnosis, and treatment. Through these diverse and dynamic initiatives, the Red Ribbon Club of GDC, Sugh Bhatoli has successfully engaged students and the wider community in health awareness, social responsibility, and collective action against HIV/AIDS and tuberculosis.

2. The Road Safety Club: The Road Safety Club of Government Degree College, Sugh-Bhatoli, District Kangra, H.P., was formed on 06/01/2022 to raise awareness about road safety among students and the community. A Rangoli competition on the theme “Be a Road Safety Hero” was held on 28-10-2024, showcasing students’ creativity and promoting safety messages. On 10-02-2025, a Social Awareness Campaign was organized in village Changrara, where students, guided by Dr. Pankaj Kaushal, educated locals on road safety rules. Participants wore printed T-shirts during the rally, emphasizing the importance of helmets and seat belts. Staff members also actively participated in the event.

3. The Ranger and Rover Unit: In the session 2023-24, the Ranger and Rover unit of Government Degree College, Sugh-Bhatoli, was registered for the first time with The Bharat Scouts and Guides, Himachal Pradesh. The unit includes 10 Rangers and 6 Rovers, guided by Mr. Shivendra Srivastava and Ms. Saroti. As the senior wing of Scouting and Guiding, the unit aims to develop youth into responsible citizens through outdoor, social, and community service activities. On 22 February 2024, World Scout Day was celebrated to honor Lord Baden-Powell’s

birth anniversary, during which volunteers performed social service at a local ashram, promoting community engagement and service.

4. Electoral Literacy Club: As per directives from the Directorate of Higher Education and CEO, H.P., the Electoral Literacy Club was established at GDC Sugh-Bhatoli on 7th July 2022 to promote electoral awareness among students. On 26th November 2024, the college celebrated Constitution Day with a quiz competition highlighting constitutional knowledge. Dr. Namesh Kumar, Principal, read the Preamble and emphasized constitutional values. Team C, led by Smriti Devi, won the quiz. Additionally, on 13th and 26th November 2024, a BLO team visited the college to register new voters, successfully completing the task with support from the club, faculty, and administration.

- **5. Career & Placement Cell (CC&PC):** In compliance with the directives from the Director of Higher Education & SPD RUSA (Order No. EDN-HE (28)G(3)-37/2020-RUSA, dated August 1, 2023), the College Career & Placement Cell (CC&PC) was reconstituted for the 2024–25 session. Key activities included coaching classes by the Economics Department for competitive exams, benefiting seven students. Alumni were registered for HIMPUN 3.0 Mega Job Fair on 30th August 2024. The cell also screened the motivational movie *12th Fail* on 9th September 2024. Additionally, an expert talk was organized in collaboration with IQAC on 23rd October 2024, featuring Ms. Amandeep Kaur as the resource person. Two days' workshop on **“Basic Computer skills and Personality Development”** was organized for the students in collaboration with CT University Ludhiana. 50 students participated in it.

6. NSS Activities Summary (2024–25): The NSS Unit of Government Degree College, Sugh-Bhatoli actively contributed to a wide range of environmental, social, and developmental initiatives throughout the academic session 2024–25. These activities reflected the students' commitment to community service, environmental sustainability, and national development. On July 30, 2024, NSS volunteers, in collaboration with the Eco Club, took part in the Government of India's "Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam" campaign. They planted 25 saplings in the newly developed college 'Vatika', which was prepared with the help of a JCB machine. This green initiative emphasized the college's environmental responsibility and encouraged a culture of tree plantation. On September 30, 2024, volunteers participated in the Swachhta Hi Sewa Abhiyan, cleaning and weeding out the college campus in collaboration with the Rangers and Rovers. This drive helped reduce potential breeding grounds for mosquitoes and hiding spots for reptiles, ensuring a cleaner and safer campus environment.

A one-day NSS camp was organized on November 7, 2024. Volunteers pruned bushes and trees around the campus to eliminate potential hideouts for insects and reptiles, especially after heavy rains. This activity ensured the pathways and surroundings were clean and accessible. On November 11, 2024, the NSS team again worked on cleaning and maintaining the college Vatika. Volunteers removed weeds, watered plants, and enhanced the overall appearance and health of the green space, showcasing their strong sense of environmental stewardship. From November 27–28, 2024, a two-day Disaster Management Training was conducted in collaboration with the District Disaster Management Authority, Kangra (HP). This training aimed to equip volunteers with essential disaster response skills. Participants were trained in casualty search methods, stretcher making using improvised materials, victim rescue techniques, and fire-fighting demonstrations. The course was highly practical and focused on real-life scenarios, enhancing the volunteers' confidence and preparedness in emergency situations. A week-long Special NSS Camp was organized from December 24, 2024, to January 1, 2025. Each day began with yoga and physical exercises, followed by community service activities in the first half of the day such as shramdan, cleanliness drives, road repair, and maintenance of the college Vatika. The second half was reserved for cultural programs and guest lectures. These sessions covered a wide range of topics, including international relations, disaster preparedness, cyber security, personal hygiene, nationalism, and career opportunities in the armed forces. The camp fostered a deep sense of civic responsibility, cultural appreciation, and social awareness among the participants. On February 22, 2025, NSS volunteers played a vital role in the successful organization of a National Seminar titled “Synergizing Sustainability: Integrating Environmental, Economic, and Social Development for a Resilient Future”. Volunteers assisted with guest registration, food service, seating arrangements, and post-seminar clean-up. Their dedication ensured the event ran smoothly and reflected the values of teamwork, discipline, and service. The NSS activities over the year were instrumental in shaping responsible, aware, and active citizens.

7. Sports Activities: Students of the college actively participated in various inter-college sports competitions during the academic year, showcasing their talent in games such as wrestling, volleyball, and kabaddi. The Annual Sports Meet was successfully organized on 27th February 2024 at the college ground. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from students who displayed their strength, stamina, and athletic skills in competitions like the 100m and 200m races, 4x100m relay, shot put, long jump, and tug of war. The sports meet fostered a spirit of healthy competition, teamwork, and physical fitness among the students. Our wrestler of B.Com I bagged bronze medal in Inter-College Wrestling competition held at GDC Indora.

4. Steps taken by the Institute/Department/ College/ to improve the quality of Education with regard to following quality parameters of NAAC for the College

i) Curricular Aspects: The institution has well established mechanism for delivering the curriculum and maintaining the record thereof. The syllabus across various departments is prepared by H.P. University, Shimla which is affiliating institution of the college after thorough discussion with academia, where college teachers participate as members of Board of Studies.

ii) Teaching – Learning & Evaluation: Teachers are encouraged to impart knowledge through innovative techniques, so that teaching becomes more effective. They are also motivated to use ICT techniques. For promoting participative learning, the societies and clubs involve the students in community-based activities and learning projects. Much emphasis is laid upon continuous comprehensive evaluation process, whereby the students are assessed on different criteria, viz. performance in class test, mid-term tests participations and presentations in seminars, quiz, debates, assignments and attendance. To evaluate teaching-learning feedbacks have been taken from students and parents and further have been evaluated.

iii) Research, Consultancy & Extension: Faculty members are encouraged to participate in academic seminars, workshops, training programmes and to organize these in college itself. The NSS, Road Safety Club, Red Ribbon Club, Eco Club, Energy Club, and different other clubs of the college involve students in community based learning activities. The students are sensitized about the significance of special days.

- On dated 24th July 2024, Department of Economics organised an event on 'Union Budget 2024-25'. Associate Professor Shashi Bhushan and Assistant Professor Shivender Srivastva delivered a lecture by Power Point Presentation. Priorities for Viksit Bharat were discussed and students were acquainted with the peculiarities of the budget. Albendazole was served to students of the College on 9th of August 2024. It is used to treat infections caused by worms. On the eve of 78th Independence Day, Dept of Economics organised an awareness test on questions related to national flag, constitution and freedom struggle. GDC Sughbhatoli celebrated 'Akshay Urja Diwas' with enthusiasm pledges to "Go Green" on August 20, 2024. The celebration, organized by the college's energy Club and Department of Physics, aimed to raise awareness about the importance of energy conservation and the adoption of green technologies. On the 23rd, August, 2024, the Department of Physics, organised a declamation competition to celebrate first National Space Day, commemorating the successful landing of the Chandrayaan-3 Vikram lander on the lunar South Polar Region. National Space Day celebrates the spirit of science, technology, and innovation, inspiring future generations to contribute to India's space program. A meaningful event organized by the Career Counselling and Placement Cell in collaboration with the Department of History on 9th September 2024. The screening of the 12th Fail movie, which portrays the real-life inspirational journey of Manoj Sharma (IPS) and Shradha Joshi (IRS), would have surely been motivational for the audience, offering insights into perseverance and determination, particularly for those aspiring to civil services or other challenging career paths. Department of Economics of the College on dated 18/9/2024 organised two hours' workshop on RBI Quiz @90 being organised by Reserve Bank of India. The Research and Development Cell, in collaboration with the Department of Economics on 25th September 2024 successfully organized an insightful event on "Hobbies for College Students". 25 students of different Mentor-Mentees Groups including students' Mentors joined the event. On the occasion of International Tourism Day, the Tourism Youth Club of the college, in association with the Department of Mathematics & Economics, organized a thought-provoking and informative event, on 27th September 2024. The theme for this year, "Tourism and Peace" aimed at exploring how tourism can act as a catalyst for unity and global peace. On 30th September 2024, Department of English celebrated International Translation Day in the College. On 4th October 2024, the Department of Physics organized a thought-provoking lecture entitled 'Role of AI in education' for the college students.
- Recognizing the central role that libraries play in the academic environment, the Department of Higher Education, Government of Himachal Pradesh, has launched an initiative to rank the libraries of government colleges across the state. As part of this initiative, an inspection team

comprising Dr. Pradeep Kumar Principal GDC Baijnath and Dr. Mohinder Pal Principal SVBGDC Palampur visited Government College Sugh-Bhatoli on **3rd September 2024** to assess the library's resources and infrastructure. The visit was part of an innovative initiative by the Department of Higher Education, Himachal Pradesh, aimed at conducting physical verification of the college's **Self-Assessment Report (SAR)** for internal college ranking. All eligible students have been registered and team appreciated the efforts of Electoral Literacy Club, staff and administration to successfully accomplishing the task. A total of 18 students successfully registered as voters, marking an important step in strengthening democratic engagement among youth. Later in the day, a team led by the Election Kanoongo inspected the entire registration drive. After observing the process and interactions with both students and officials, the team expressed their appreciation for the collaborative efforts displayed by the club.
- In compliance with the directions given by the Secretary, UGC, Constitution Day was celebrated with great enthusiasm at Government Degree College Sugh Bhatoli on 26th November 2024. Dr. Namesh Kumar, the Principal of the college, congratulated the students on this significant occasion and elaborated on the history of the Indian Constitution's formation and its importance in shaping the nation. He also read the Preamble of the Constitution to instill constitutional values

among the students. The celebration included a quiz competition which was the highlight of the event.

- A three days basic course for a task force of youth volunteers on “Disaster Preparedness and Response” was organised by the District Disaster Management Authority, Kangra (HP) in our college. The first day (27 November 2024) of the course aimed to equip youth volunteers with essential skills to effectively respond to disaster situations. On the inaugural day, participants underwent rigorous training in crucial search and rescue techniques. The training module included: Casualty Search Methods: Volunteers learned systematic approaches to locate individuals trapped or injured in disaster-stricken areas. Stretcher Making: Practical demonstrations and hands-on training were provided to construct improvised stretchers using readily available materials. Victim Rescue Techniques: Participants were instructed on safe and efficient methods to evacuate victims from hazardous environments. Fire Fighting Demonstration: Experts showcased firefighting equipment and techniques, highlighting the importance of early intervention in controlling fires.
- On 11th December 2024, a memorandum of understanding (MoU) was signed between Government Degree College Sug-Bhatoli, Government Senior Secondary School Makrauli, Dagla, Sugh-Bhatoli, Government High School Sauhra, Government Middle School Kothi, and Government Primary Schools Mandoli and Sug-Tarkhana for **"Resource Sharing and Capacity Building"**. Representatives from various schools participated in this event.
- A National Seminar on the theme ‘**Synergizing Sustainability: Integrating Environmental, Economic, and Social Development for a Resilient Future**’ was held on 22/02/2025 at GDC Sugh- Bhatoli, bringing together eminent scholars, policymakers, and academicians to deliberate on the multifaceted aspects of sustainability. The seminar provided a dynamic platform for discussing strategies to balance environmental conservation, economic growth, and social equity to build a resilient future. The event saw insightful discussions from distinguished speakers, including Dr. N. N. Sharma, Dr. Madhukar Gompala, Dr. Sushil Kumar Singh, and Abhimanyu Singh Arha, each of whom shared their perspectives on sustainability.
- The Career Counseling and Placement Cell of the Government Degree College Sugh-Bhatoli successfully organized a two-day workshop on **"Basic Computer Skills and Personality Development"** on the 19th and 20th of March 2025. The workshop aimed to equip students with fundamental computer knowledge and essential soft skills necessary to navigate the competitive job market. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from students across various disciplines and alumni. The resource persons for the workshop were Mr. Rohit Kumar and Ms.

- In the Month of May 2025, college faculty under the leadership of Dr Namesh Kumar, Principal of the College visited various Sr. Sec. Schools of the periphery and interacted with staff and students regarding increasing students' enrollment.
- On the occasion of 11th International Yoga Day on 21st June 2025, NSS Unit of the College organized a significant session under the theme '**Yoga for One Earth, One Health**' aligning Yoga with Sustainability and global well-being. NSS Programme Officer, Assistant Professor Shivendra Srivastva practiced students Yoga Asana. Approximately 50 participants attended the enlightening session, engaging actively with resource person by asking questions which were addressed satisfactorily.

iv). Infrastructure and Learning Resources: At present, the college has beautiful campus including 07 class rooms, 02 science labs, 01 computer lab, a library, a girl common room, a smart class room, a sports room and a playground too. ICT lab is equipped with five computers and an interactive panel. The college also has a common room for girls and a small canteen which cater to the needs of students sufficiently. The college has very capable faculty comprising 7 teachers who efficiently work for the welfare of the students and the college. The Library of the college has 2692 books; subscribed three magazines, three newspapers and two journals.

v) Student Support and Progression: Students are encouraged to contribute their creative ideas, compositions and innovations in the college magazine 'Sughanchal'. There is 'Career Counseling and Guidance Cell' in the college. This cell guides students to plan their career. Job advertisements are circulated to students through notice board and class groups on whatsapp. The staff members also guide new entrants about CBCS, Anti-ragging, cleanliness and participation in various curricular and extra-curricular activities for their overall development through mentor-mentee groups. The students excel in these activities and join in the field of their interest after completion of UG degree. Alumni Association has been formed and meetings have been conducted. Scholarship committee has been supportive to students to fill in forms for various post-matric scholarships. Feedback from students and parents is collected and effort for their incorporation is carried out for the betterment. Weak students are given opportunity to attend remedial classes. From this session, a system of mentor-mentees groups has been initiated. The goal is to help mentees learn from the experience of mentors, who can help them navigate their careers and life.

vi). Governance and Leadership: The College has different committees like RUSA, IQAC, Anti-Ragging, Discipline Committee, Sexual Harassment and Grievances Redressal Committee, CSCA body, Red Ribbon Club, Road Safety Club, PTA, OSA, etc. The college regularly holds meeting with PTA and

CSCA. The faculty is assigned the posts of Bursar and Secretary of the Staff Council. The committee members are allowed to function independently after due consultation with the Principal. Some of the committees also include student members.

vii) Innovative Practices: Making the student community socially awakened and responsible, the college imbibes a sense of social responsibility in its students by engaging them in a number of extension activities, maintaining a perfect balance between academics and extracurricular activities. Especially abled students have been assisted throughout the session. College has signed MOUs with nearby Sr. Secondary Schools under the Knowledge Sharing and Capacity Building Initiative. Students are guided via mentor-mentees groups and lectures are being conducted through subject societies. Resources like water and energy are being used economically and a sense of responsibility has been put in the students through interactive sessions of energy and eco clubs.
