Introduction of the College:

The history of Government Degree College Sugh Bhatoli dates back to July 1992, when the visionary saint Faqir Chand, renowned for his wisdom, foresight, and unwavering commitment to the service of humanity, established the institution under the name *Deen Dyal Mahesh Public College*. The transformation of this noble initiative into a government institution stands as a testament to the dedicated efforts of the revered founder, public representatives, the local community, and the staff members whose collective endeavors culminated in the college being taken over by the Government of Himachal Pradesh. Consequently, the institution was rechristened as Government Degree College Sugh Bhatoli vide Order No. EDN-A-Ka(1)-6/2015 issued by the Principal Secretary (Higher Education) to the Government of Himachal Pradesh on 6 August 2016.

Since its inception, the college has been imparting quality higher education in diverse streams, including Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.), and Bachelor of Science (B.Sc. Non-Medical). The institution continues to play a pivotal role in nurturing the academic aspirations of rural youth and promoting the universalization of higher education—one of the foremost objectives of the Government of Himachal Pradesh, particularly in the remote and rural regions of the state.

National Service Scheme

- International Yoga Day was celebrated on 21 June 2025 under the theme "*Yoga for One Earth, One Health*." The programme aimed to connect yoga with sustainable development and global well-being.
- Under the campaign "*Ek Ped Maa Ke Naam*" (A Tree in Mother's Name), NSS volunteers carried out a plantation drive in the college campus on 19 July 2025.

ii. Sports Activities

The college proudly participated in three Inter-College competitions organized during September and October 2025. The students displayed remarkable sportsmanship and dedication in these events.

- The **Kabaddi (Men's) Team** participated in the competition held at Sidharth Government College, Nadaun (District Hamirpur) from 24/09/2025 to 27/09/2025.
- The **Cross Country (Men's) Team** competed in the event organized at Government College, Sangrah (District Sirmaur) from 29/09/2025 to 30/09/2025.
- The **Wrestling (Men's) Championship** was held at Government Degree College, Daulatpur Chowk (District Una) from 03/10/2025 to 04/10/2025. Notably, **Amit Kumar** secured the overall third position and won a bronze medal, bringing pride to the college.

Road Safety Club

- New road signage flex boards were installed in the college campus and old display boards were renovated to enhance road safety awareness among students.

Women Cell /

- A second cleanliness and plantation drive was organized on 13 September 2025. On this occasion, students planted saplings of mango, lemon, and *Lughat*, contributing further to the greenery of the campus.

Complaint Box and Listening Ear Initiative

At Government Degree College Sugh-Bhatoli, a system of the "Complaint Box and Listening Ear Initiative" has been established for the redressal of students' grievances. The complaint box is opened every 15 days in the presence of the Principal and members of the committee. All received complaints and issues are addressed and resolved at the earliest possible time.

Electoral Literacy Club (ELC)

On 20 December 2025, a lecture was organized on the topic "*The Process of Election and Students' Role in Democracy*." The lecture was delivered by the resource person, **Dr. Rohit**

Gandhi, in which students were made aware of the electoral process and their role in strengthening democracy.

Cyber Security Cell

On 03 October 2025, a Cyber Security Awareness lecture was organized in the ICT laboratory of the college by Associate Professor **Shashi Bhushan**. On this occasion, Assistant Professor **Dr. Rohit Gandhi** and Assistant Professor **Shivendra Srivastava** also informed students about various cyber threats and the measures to deal with them.

Research and Development Cell

- On 18 August 2025, a special lecture was organized on the topic "*Viksit Bharat @2047 – Key Initiatives Extracted from PM Speech on 79th Independence Day.*"
- A research study was conducted on the haemoglobin levels among female students and staff members of Government Degree College Sugh-Bhatoli. The study was based on a cross-sectional survey method and was descriptive and quantitative in nature, with sample analysis carried out by the medical team of Civil Hospital, Indora. The findings revealed that a majority of samples (96.67%) had haemoglobin levels below normal, with 60% falling in the mild anaemia category and 36.67% in the moderate anaemia category.

Disaster Management Cell

The Disaster Management Cell has been actively participating in various awareness activities related to disasters. In August 2025, an amount of ₹20,100 was collected by the staff and students of the college, out of which ₹13,900 was spent on relief work in the Mand area of Indora Tehsil, while the remaining ₹6,200 was deposited in the Chief Minister's Relief Fund. **Jagan Singh, Assistant Professor (Commerce)** participated in a training programme for nodal officers organized by the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA), Kangra, from 25 to 27 September 2025, under the *10-Point Agenda on Disaster Risk Reduction by the Prime Minister*.

Student Mental Health and Well-being Cell

The Student Mental Health and Well-being Cell is actively functioning in the college and provides students with mental and emotional counselling and support. In collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), the Cell successfully organized a National Webinar on "*Mental Health and Emotional Well Being*" on 02 December 2025, which helped promote awareness and sensitivity towards mental health issues.

College e-Magazine

The fourth edition of the college e-magazine '*Sughanchal*' is being published under the guidance of Associate Professor **Shashi Bhushan**. In this session, new sections have been included to encourage students' creativity, such as *Knowledge Vision, Skills, Entrepreneurship and Finance, Digital Era and Innovation, Green Future, Health and Well-being, Culture, and Creative Expression*.

Parents-Teacher Association (PTA)

The Parents-Teacher Association is continuously playing an important role in the development of the college. Under the leadership of PTA President **Mrs. Seema Devi** and other members, various academic and co-curricular activities have been encouraged and supported.

College Students Central Association (CSCA)

The College Students Central Association (CSCA) is an integral part of the institution, serving as a strong bridge between students and the administration. It is formed on a merit basis. For the current session, **Shivangi (B.Sc. III Year)** has been elected President, **Palak (B.A. III Year)** Vice President, **Nitish Pathania (B.Sc. II Year)** General Secretary, and **Tanisha Sharma (B.A. I Year)** Joint Secretary.

Alumni Association

The Alumni Association has been actively functioning since the academic session 2023–24. It is duly registered under the Himachal Pradesh Societies Registration Act. Regular meetings of the

association focus on the development of the college, engagement of alumni, and academic advancement, thereby contributing significantly to the overall progress of the institution.

Developmental and Creative Achievements of the College

The college has made remarkable progress in the fields of academics, culture, and infrastructure. The strengthening of modern classrooms, library upgradation, laboratory enhancement, and expansion of ICT facilities has significantly improved the teaching-learning process. Active student participation in NSS, sports, and cultural activities has further encouraged creativity. Various committees have contributed to discipline, leadership, and a sense of social responsibility. The details of these activities are as follows:

- The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) organized two National Seminars—one in the session 2024–25 on *"Synergizing Sustainability: Integrating Environmental, Economic and Social Development for Resilient Future"* and another in the session 2025–26 on *"Indigenous Knowledge System, Digital Pedagogy and Self Reliance: Higher Education as a Catalyst for Viksit Bharat @2047."*
- The college has signed two Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) under industry-academia collaboration, one with Surya Weld Arc Industries and another with Shri Hari Glass Industries. These collaborations aim to provide students with practical exposure, skill development, and employment opportunities.
- In the recently released SAR College Ranking, 141 colleges were evaluated, out of which 42 colleges were placed in Tier-II. Government Degree College Sugh-Bhatoli secured the 34th position among Tier-II institutions. In the library ranking assessment conducted by the Department of Higher Education, the college library received a preliminary level ranking.
- The Department of Higher Education installed five CCTV cameras in the institution.
- Books worth ₹14,430 were purchased for the library. An amount of ₹10,300 was spent on improving library facilities, and ₹20,500 was spent on repairing book shelves.
- Under community service initiatives, staff and students contributed ₹20,100. Under the leadership of Assistant Professor Jagan Singh and laboratory assistants Rakesh and Ajay,

the Disaster Management team visited the Mand area and distributed fodder for livestock affected by floods. Additionally, ₹6,200 was donated to the Chief Minister's Relief Fund.

- The Director of Transport, Himachal Pradesh, sanctioned ₹10,000 under the Himachal Pradesh Road Safety Fund and Activities Rules 2022 for road safety awareness programmes.
- Social worker Shri Sushil Kumar donated ₹11,000 for the development activities of the college.
- Under the *Unnat Bharat Abhiyan*, the college received seed money of ₹50,000 for the development of five adopted villages: Sugh Panchan, Bhattoli, Gangwal, Kamoh, and Madoli.
- Under the ICT education initiative, interested students are being provided free computer education under the guidance of **Dr. Rohit Gandhi (Assistant Professor, Mathematics)**. Training includes MS Word, PowerPoint, Excel, Canva, OverLeaf, and LaTeX.
- Dr. Rohit Gandhi also served as a mentor in the *Online Foundation Course in Mathematics*, conducted under the MTTS Trust and the National Board for Higher Mathematics, Government of India.
- Under the MoU between the Government of Himachal Pradesh and Crack Academy, the "*Mere Shehar ke 100 Ratan*" scholarship examination was conducted.. Out of 56 students, 24 were selected, including 2 students with 100% scholarship, 5 with 75%, and 17 with 50% scholarships.
- On the occasion of Indora Utsav, 25 students of the college participated in the "*Chitta Mukti Walkathon*." The rally was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Himachal Pradesh, Shri Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu. The students also interacted with Self Help Groups (SHGs) and learned about the principles of entrepreneurship.

Future and Needs Plans

- The college building infrastructure is old and requires immediate repair and renovation.
- Vacant teaching positions in Hindi, Political Science, and Chemistry need to be filled at the earliest.
- The ICT laboratory requires additional resources and modern equipment to enhance digital learning facilities.
